

Covid Catch Up Premium Report – 2020-2021

Strategy
At The Humberston C of E Primary, through our vision, we constantly strive to provide an holistic education that prepares our pupils with the tools, skills and fervour to become their own shining rays of light, opening the door to a brighter future for all. We recognise that all groups of pupils will have felt the effects of the school closures and that this will have impacted them in different ways academically, socially and emotionally. For many, quality first teaching from their teacher who knows them best will begin to narrow any gaps formed during the closure. This will be supplemented with interventions focussed on child specific skills delivered by the class teacher or Teaching Assistant. For some pupils however, more intensive measures may be needed in order to bring their learning back in line with their peers. Whilst we cannot recuperate the time lost, we can ensure our time is used smartly to make the biggest impact. In September, all pupils returned back to school. During the Autumn Term, the children were all re-assessed and baseline judgements were formed. These formative assessments were used to inform teachers planning, differentiation and interventions and targets were shared with parents during the virtual Parents' Evenings. Towards the end of the Autumn term, teachers completed extensive summative assessments, which pinpointed the children's next steps. Each child is discussed at regular pupil progress meetings where senior leaders, subject coordinators, SENCo and class teachers formulate the next steps for the child and plan how these will be achieved. During the Spring Term, all pupils have logged on to our remote learning platform Google Classroom with 97% of pupils actively engaging with their learning on a daily basis. The remaining 3% are completing their learning at home through alternative methods and all families and teachers remain in weekly contact. Teachers assess submitted work from Google Classroom, emails and physical work handed in by pupils of key workers attending school, making any necessary adjustments according to how heavily supported the child's

work was. Collating all of this information has meant that we have a clear picture of the pupils who have been most detrimentally affected by the closures ensuring we can act swiftly to put plans in place for them.

Our priorities

- Consolidation and extension of children's written and mental methods in Maths, including recall of number facts.
- Reading – through phonics and decoding and through comprehension
- Well-being – Supporting children's emotional needs to improve learning behaviours, stamina and concentration
- Writing – Independence and editing.

Aims of the catch up Premium Spending

- To ensure all children have a secure understanding of the basic concepts within reading, writing and maths, which can be transferred, applied and built upon within their year and ability group.
- To ensure our children's emotional and social wellbeing is supported enabling pupils to be ready and focussed to learn, maximising their learning time.
